Children in public care (looked after children) ii. Pupils who live in the designated villages i.e. Bozeat, Brafield-on-the-Green, Castle Ashby, Chadstone, Cogenhoe, Denton, Easton Maudit, Great Houghton, Grendon, Irchester, Little Houghton, Strixton, Wollaston, Yardley Hastings, Whiston. iii. Pupils who will have an older brother or sister continuing at Wollaston School in September 2009. iv. Pupils who live in Wellingborough and the designated surrounding villages and contributory parishes for Wellingborough. v. Other pupils
